Ingham County Leaders Endorse Bernero for Governor

List Includes Rev. Dr. Michael C. Murphy

Lansing, MICH. – Today 24 area leaders and organizations announced their endorsement of Lansing Mayor and Democratic gubernatorial candidate Virg Bernero for Governor.

Included in the list is former State Legislator and Chair of the Michigan Legislative Black Caucus Rev. Dr. Michael C. Murphy, Local Ingham County officials, including members of the Board of Commissioners, the City Clerk, City Councilmembers, Sheriff and Township officials announced their support of Virg Bernero to lead Michigan (see below for the full list of endorsements).

Those endorsing said they are proud and supportive of Virg because of his record as Mayor of the City of Lansing. As the only mayor in Michigan's gubernatorial race, he has a unique understanding of the challenges facing Michigan's communities.

"I am pleased to support Virg Bernero for Governor! I believe he is the strongest candidate to address the critical issues in Michigan's urban communities and the best hope for an urban policy that will provide opportunities for working families who have been hit hard by this current economic condition in Michigan," said Murphy. "His record of working with urban mayors and leaders in the business, labor, and faith communities and his knowledge of urban issues from job creation to helping families deal with home foreclosure and improving urban education makes him the logical choice for Michigan's urban citizens."

As part of Bernero's Main Street Michigan Agenda, Virg will promote and nurture small businesses on Michigan's Main Streets because this is where the bulk of new jobs will be created. Virg's innovative state bank proposal will open up credit opportunities for businesses of all sizes by partnering with Michigan-based community banks and credit unions to make loans for new equipment and facility expansions that create new jobs.

"Every strong state in our nation has strong cities that drive them," said Bernero. "For too long, we have operated under the 'hole in the donut' theory of development that drives investment around cities but never inside of them. Cities need to be the hub of the wheel, not the hole in the donut. I know this first-hand as a mayor of Lansing and will bring this critical perspective to the governor's office."
